PC047 – Preaching

In this unit, students will build on previous units in biblical interpretation to learn about the history and purpose of preaching, its central place in the life of a healthy church, and the many ways the riches of Scripture can be shaped and communicated for maximum impact. The unit is highly practical and will be differentiated to support new and seasoned preachers.

PC025 – Denominational Distinctives

In this unit, students will undertake in-depth study of the Basis of Union of the Uniting Church in Australia, along with exploration of distinctive features of the church such as baptismal and Eucharistic theology, the interconciliar system of governance, covenanting between indigenous and non-indigenous Christians, the multicultural church, and theological and practical understandings of Christian engagement in social justice.

OT001 – Old Testament Foundations

This unit is one part of our two-semester introduction to the Old Testament. In this unit, we journey through the foundational stories in the Old Testament from Genesis through Kings. Together we consider these texts in their ancient Near Eastern and contemporary Christian contexts.

OT026 – Genesis (English)

The book of Genesis is foundational to Christian belief and faith. In this unit, we consider what the book of Genesis has to teach us about the world, human beings, and the God who cares for them. Flood and famine, romance and royalty, bloodshed and betrayal - Genesis has it all.

NT001 – Jesus and the Gospels

The unit *Jesus and the Gospels* investigates the identity and life of Jesus as presented by the Gospel accounts in the New Testament. By looking at each Gospel, as well as their interrelationships, the unit seeks to develop an account of the ministry of Jesus, reflecting on his significance for contemporary life and ministry.

CH005 – Early Church History

The history of the church is, in a sense, a Christian's autobiography; we only embrace our identity by attending to our story. Drawing on primary and secondary sources, the unit *Early Church History* will introduce students to the key people, texts, movements, and doctrinal decisions of the time between the apostles and the Council of Chalcedon.

TH023 – Thinking Theologically

What is the relationship between the various theological disciplines? How should we think about the nature and authority of Scripture? What is the distinctive role of other sources for theology: tradition, reason, worship, and encompassing all of these, experience? In *Thinking Theologically*, our goal is to introduce students to the landscape of theological practices that constitute theological education, pulling the threads together so that our theological work can interact wisely in our broader social and political context.

EM018 – Ministry in a Culturally Diverse Context (4 Saturdays in Feb & Mar)

Stepping into cross-cultural ministry can be daunting. This unit will help you understand culture and develop strategies for overcoming cultural barriers. We'll explore how to empower churches to become dynamic multicultural communities.

OT036 – Interpreting & Applying the Psalms (Mon-Fri in June)

In this unit, we learn that there is a psalm for every season of life - if we know where to find it! Together we will practice close reading and learn best practices for reading, preaching, and living the Psalms.
